



Summary

Standard Bank has adopted the EDM Council's DCAM® (Data Management Capability Assessment Model), a framework designed to enhance data management processes and nurture a data-centric culture. This is significantly improving the utilization of data analytics, transforming the client experience, and driving sustainable value for the business. Standard Bank is also striving toward recognition as a world-class data management leader through its engagement in the EDM Council's Data Excellence program.

Business Challenge

Standard Bank recognized the essential value of data as a critical asset, that, if not well managed, would undermine its mission of being Africa-focused, client-led, and digitally enabled. The bank operates across multiple regions, each with distinct regulatory requirements plus challenges due to organisational silos between data and technology. These silos impeded the bank's ability to leverage data for better internal decision-making, deliver outstanding client experiences, and accelerate digital innovation.



The DCAM solution

Standard Bank uses DCAM to create a standardized approach to measure data management capabilities and facilitate a common language between both data and non-data professionals, including to:

- Ensure analytics and technology implementations align with overall data management strategies.
- Use an evidence-based approach to improve change management outcomes, making data management more relevant and practical for the business and increasing adoption of best practices.
- Develop a roadmap to achieve a digitally enabled and client-centric business model that supports Africa's growth through ethical data use.

Since embarking on the EDM Council's Data Excellence Program, Standard Bank has engaged Ortecha, an EDM Council certified partner, to help validate and refine its journey forward.
